Here are a few reasons why you taking part in the Parent, Pupil and Learner Voice is so important.



You are contributing to vital education research

This research is vital to the Department for Education because it provides regular, fast information to those who make decisions about education in England.



What you think is important

Having parent, pupils and learner voices included in research increases the accuracy of the data and its power to inform policy making.

The survey has impact!

Last year we asked parents about childcare for before and after school. The Head of Wraparound Childcare Unit told us that the information from the Parent, Pupil and Voice made a substantial contribution to the Department for Education's case to fund the new Wraparound Childcare Programme. The findings were even mentioned in a budget speech in the House of Commons.

Spotlight - do pupils enjoy going to school?

Parents and pupils were asked about how enjoyable attending school was.

Parents and pupils told us different things. Most parents said their children had enjoyed going to school every day or most days, but less than half of pupils said the same.*

*The respondents to the parents and pupils surveys may not have come from the same household.



Parents of secondary school pupils said their children enjoyed going to school every day or most days. 45%

Parents of Year 7 to 11 pupils told us that they had enjoyed going to school every day or most days in the past week.
